SAEM Advancement of Women in Academic Emergency Medicine Award - (Presented at SAEM Annual Meeting)

The Advancement of Women in Academic Emergency Medicine Award honors an SAEM member who has made significant contributions to the advancement of women in academic emergency medicine.

The Awards Committee wishes to consider as many exceptional candidates as possible and is committed to an inclusive process of granting awards, reflecting the full spectrum of diversity of our membership. We encourage you to nominate a diverse pool of candidates for all SAEM awards.

The nomination period for 2025 SAEM Awards is October 1 to December 9, 2025. Please note that the SAEM Awards Committee has developed a standardized letter template for you to use when creating your nomination packet.

Eligibility

The nomination of any SAEM member who has contributed toward the purpose of this award will be accepted. Candidates are evaluated for their impact on advancing the individual, as well as the collective successes of women in academic emergency medicine positions. This award is intended to address contributions not addressed by other SAEM Awards. Criteria for the award include:

- Mentoring and support of women in EM academic productivity and advancement
- National leadership in support of women in academic EM
- Contributions to the advancement of EM regionally, nationally, or internationally

Guidelines

Nominations may be submitted by any current SAEM member. Nominations should include a copy of the candidate's CV and a cover letter describing his or her qualifications. Each completed application must include the following:

- A brief (1 2 paragraph) biographical summary
- Person nominating the candidate (include mailing address, phone and fax numbers, and email address)
- Statement on the candidate's impact on individual women or groups of women in academic emergency medicine with clear examples and detail (please download the standardized letter template to create your statement)
- While not mandatory, a maximum of 2 additional support letters may be submitted (these may use the standardized letter template or be written free-form, limited to 2 pages)
- Person nominating award candidate (including mailing address, phone and fax numbers

and email address)

• Contact information of department administrator or media persons that should be notified if the award is received.

SAEMF/Academy for Women in Academic Emergency Medicine (AWAEM) Research Grant

Purpose of the Award

The SAEMF/AWAEM Research Grant awards \$10,000 over a one-year period starting July 1 to support one early career investigator to address a research question in line with the core purpose of the Academy for Women in Academic Emergency Medicine, as described below:

The core purpose of the Academy for Women in Academic Emergency Medicine (AWAEM) is to enhance the recruitment, promotion, career satisfaction, advancement, and retention of women in academic emergency medicine throughout their careers and to advance our understanding of the role of sex and gender in emergency care.

This award is intended to allow for preliminary data collection, analysis or collection of pilot data that will further support greater research endeavors.

Expectations of the Award

The SAEMF/AWAEM Research Grant awardee is expected to:

- Attend the SAEM Annual Meeting during the award year.
- Submit interim and final progress reports in accordance with SAEMF instructions.
- Submit an abstract reporting the results of the research project for presentation at the SAEM Annual Meeting. As the selection of research abstracts is a competitive process, acceptance is not assured.
- Publish a manuscript (first-authored by the awardee) arising from the project in a peer-reviewed journal within two years of completing the award.

Eligibility for the Award

An applicant for the AWAEM Research Grant must:

- Be a member of SAEM in good standing at application deadline and during the entire award period.
- Have an advanced/doctoral or terminal educational degree (e.g., MD, DO, PhD, PharmD, DSc or equivalent).

- Hold a university appointment in or be actively involved (e.g., have an adjunct appointment) with a department or division of emergency medicine or pediatric emergency medicine at the start of the award period. The applicant may work as a clinician at an institution other than the host institution or the institution at which the project will be conducted.
- Be an early career researcher, defined as completing initial residency training within eight
 (8) years of the start of the award period.

SAEMF will consider requests for exceptions to this requirement for various reasons, including but not limited to medical concerns, disability, and active-duty military service. Each of these requests is reviewed on a case by case basis, and must be made prior to the application deadline. SAEM will approve an automatic extension of one year for childbirth within the early career period. All extension requests must be made to grants@saem.org before the nomination deadline. Fellowship training does not affect the requirement for defining an early career researcher.

AWAEM Research Award

This award recognizes an individual whose research meaningfully advances the AWAEM mission of promotion, recruitment, retention, and advancement of women in academic emergency medicine. It is designed to support and celebrate scholars—particularly those pursuing pilot projects or multi-center studies—whose work is not currently non-funded. Recipients are encouraged to also consider applying for the larger SAEMF/AWAEM Research Grant to support their research project.

Application:

All applications must be submitted electronically to awaem@saem.org.

Applications must be emailed as a single file in .pdf format. The subject line of the email should read "2025 AWAEM Research Award".

Awardees will be required to submit a twice annual progress report and will deliver a brief presentation at the AWAEM academy meeting during the SAEM Annual Meeting in May.

Eligibility:

• The candidate must be a member of AWAEM

Selection Criteria:

Candidates will be prioritized based on their research's 1) alignment with AWAEM's mission and objectives, 2) significance and potential for impact; 3) feasibility of the research within the

overall proposed budget and timeline and proposed funding sources (not limited to this \$1,000 award); and 4) Attestation of IRB submission at the time of the application (if applicable).

Award Amount:

The AWAEM Research Award includes a financial prize of \$1,000 to the awardee.

Application Deadline: November 8, 2025, 11:59pm PST

Review Process and Timeline: Materials will be reviewed by the AWAEM Research Committee Chairs (if no conflict exists) and members of the AWAEM Executive Committee. Award decisions will be finalized by early January, with funds distributed by mid-January 2026.

AACEM/AWAEM CDP Scholarship

This scholarship supports participation by a rising academic emergency medicine leader who supports the AWAEM mission.

 The core purpose of the Academy for Women in Academic Emergency Medicine (AWAEM) is to enhance the recruitment, promotion, career satisfaction, advancement, and retention of women in academic emergency medicine throughout their careers and to advance our understanding of the role of sex and gender in emergency care.

Eligibility:

Must be a current AWAEM Member to apply.

AWAEM Mentor Award

To honor an AWAEM member who has shown significant dedication to mentorship in academic emergency medicine through mentorship, research sponsorship, education, advocacy, or administration, and who serves as an exceptional role model, advancing mentees in academic emergency medicine.

Eligibility:

- 1. AWAEM faculty member in a North American academic EM department
- 2. Current SAEM and AWAEM member (no later than January 1, 2026) not currently serving on the AWAEM Awards Committee or Executive Council

Selection Criteria:

- 1. Evidence of dedication to academic EM though a consistent track record of excellent clinical work and outstanding professionalism.
- 2. Evidence of promoting equity and inclusion in emergency medicine through advising, advocacy, mentorship, and efforts to advance systemic change that support the advancement of women and other historically underrepresented groups in the field.
- 3. An AWAEM faculty member whose colleagues feel serves as an exemplary role model.

- 2. One nomination letter detailing nominee's impact. A nomination letter may be submitted by current or former colleagues, mentors, mentees or employers.

- 1. AWAEM faculty member in a North American academic EM department
- 2. Must be within 10 years since residency graduation or fellowship graduation whichever date is later (i.e. graduated in 2015 or later)

3. Current SAEM and AWAEM member (no later than January 1, 2026) not currently serving on the AWAEM Awards Committee or Executive Council

Note: Any faculty nominee who took significant time away from academic medicine may be considered with an explanation of lapsed time. Please include a letter of explanation of time lapse if greater than 10 years from date of residency completion (earlier than 2015) but still considered "early career" in terms of accomplishments and rank.

- 2. Must be 10 to 17 years since residency graduation or fellowship graduation whichever date is later (i.e. graduated in 2016 or earlier)
- 3. Current SAEM and AWAEM member (no later than January 1, 2026) not currently serving on the AWAEM Awards Committee or Executive Council

Note: Any faculty nominee who took significant time away from academic medicine may be considered with explanation of lapsed time. Please include a letter of explanation of a time lapse greater than 17 years from date of residency completion, but still considered "mid" career in terms of accomplishments.

1. Evidence of achievements, innovation, and dedication to academic emergency

- medicine through research, teaching, service, advocacy, or administration sustained over the course of the nominee's career.
- 2. National involvement and presence in academic emergency medicine

- Special consideration will be given to individuals who have contributed to advancing
 equitable workplace policies, including those that support family leave, gender equity,
 or broader inclusivity efforts within their department.

- High retention of women faculty

- Environment of transparency with respect to salary, benefits, and the promotions process
