

1. Case Narrative

Opening Information

The patient is a 50 yo female complaining of lip swelling that she woke up with this morning. No antecedent symptoms.

Chronic (“smokers”) cough.

Physical Assessment will reveal:

- Tachycardia
- Mild tachypnea
- Wheezing

Non-simulator-based findings:

- Lip swelling
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Scenario conditions initially

1. History patient gives: Woke up with lip swelling
Patients initial exam: hypertensive
2. Patients physiology: LVH,

Scenario branch points

1. 50 yo female with angioedema and impending airway obstruction
2. Will progress to complete obstruction and require a surgical airway for stabilization.
